
### APPRECIATION AND SPECIAL AWARDS WINNER




## LAND MANAGER OF THE YEAR Courtney Rose




## THIEF OF TIME AWARD Larry Bourne and Foster Knutson

Larry and Foster have been partners for several years and monitor sites within the Tucson and San Pedro Regions. RCs can always count on these two to be available to handle high risk areas. Concise and detailed vandalism reports and associated photos submitted by this team has led to the apprehension of alleged vandals. On May 5, 2021, Larry and Foster were visiting Rail X site -a heavily damaged site area due to mountain bikers and OHV users -and discovered a couple of men stealing artifacts. The information they obtained about these individuals was sent to Rob Vaitkus, a BLM officer who was able to ID them allowing the County Attorney's Office to charge the individuals with theft and trespassing.
